SOME BIBLICAL FACTS ABOUT ANGELS IN HONOR OF THE FEAST OF ST MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL, TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8: Angels are bodiless spirits, created to serve God (Psalm 104,4; Hebrews 1,14) primarily through worship (Isaiah 6,1-6). Angels serve as God's messengers (Luke 1; Matthew 28). Michael commands the heavenly "hosts" (armies). He assisted Israel in the Battle of Jericho (Joshua 5, 13-15) and opposed the fallen angels led by Satan (Revelation 12,7-9; Jude 9). A Guardian Angel is assigned to each Christian at baptism (Psalm 91, 11-12; Tobit 5-6). Angels will announce the end of the world (1 Thessalonians 4,16). The bodiless angels sometimes appear in a visible form in the Bible and this is how the holy icons depict them: with wings, representing their constant motion in God's service, and dressed as soldiers or messengers depending on the particular service they offer. Isaiah 6 describes "six-winged seraphim;" Ezekiel 1 and 10 describes the cherubim as "all eyes." The mirror angels sometimes hold represents their contemplation of God. ***Mnohaja l'ita to all our Michaels!***
