SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 11: FIRST ALL SOULS' SATURDAY: Our faithful departed are remembered by name on five Saturdays each year: one before Lent, three during Lent and on the day before Pentecost.

There is an envelope in your box on which you can list the names of the deceased you wish to have remembered and make a token sacrificial offering on their behalf. This small offering, like a Liturgy stipend, is made to the priest, not to the parish. If your list has not changed since last year, you do not need to rewrite the names; they are already recorded in our Book of Remembrance. If you have never submitted a list (called a "hramota") bring it with you to Liturgy on Saturday, February 11, at 9am.
